1. Duration of Programme: The duration shall be ONE academic Year. The fees for the examination also shall be prescribed by the university from time to time.

2. Eligibility Criteria For Admission:

- i. For Diploma in Cyber Laws and Intellectual Property Rights eligibility criteria is any candidate who has passed graduation from any recognized university in India
- ii. For Diploma in Criminology eligibility criteria is graduation in Law (LL.B.) or Post Graduate in Social Sciences with 48 % marks
- iii. For Diploma in Labour Law eligibility criteria is graduation in Law (LL.B.) or Master degree in any discipline with 48 % marks
- iv. For Intellectual Property Rights eligibility criteria is any candidate who has passed graduation from any recognized university in India

3. Evaluation in Exams: Evaluation system will be according to Credit Based Award Pattern.

4. Exam Pattern in Diploma course there are 4 Specialization group namely:

- i. Criminology Law
- ii. Labour Law
- iii. Intellectual Property Law
- iv. Cyber Law

Each student taking admission to the Diploma Course has to study 6 Papers in one year .All papers are compulsory.

5. Medium of Instruction and Examination: The medium of instruction and examination shall be English as well as Hindi

6. Examination System: Each course shall be of 100 marks.
